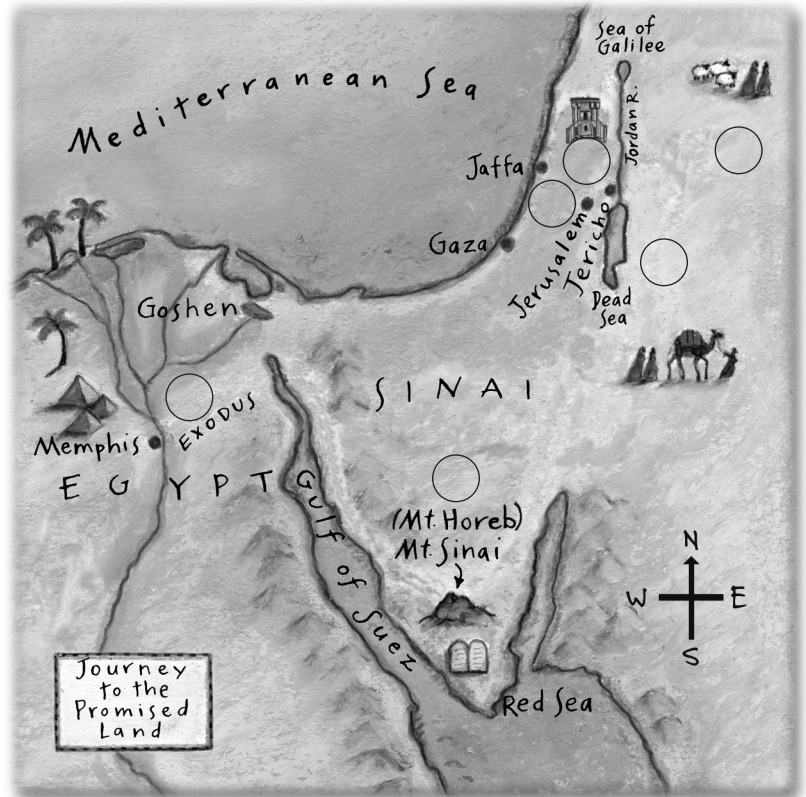


Journey to the Promised Land
