Trust and Prayer</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Recall ways in which other people take care of our needs and wants Understand that we, like Esther, can trust in God to help us meet our needs and should pray to him with persistence Give examples of the necessary elements of prayer—faith and persistence. Jesus’ life and teachings are connected to God’s promises in the Old Testament.</p>	<p>17.
