In the Time of Jesus

Illness and Sin For centuries, the Israelites believed that illness or affliction was punishment from God for having sinned. The evil actions of groups were thought to bring about natural calamities, plagues, or misfortune. Jesus rejected such connections. However, Jesus often linked healing someone with the forgiveness of that person's sins to show God's power over both body and soul.

You can read of Jesus' healing powers in Mark 5:21–42.

OUR CATHOLIC TRADITION in Religious Life

Blessed Damien de Veuster Damien de Veuster was a holy person who risked his life caring for others. Born in Belgium in 1840, he joined the Sacred Heart Fathers as a young man. After ordination to the priesthood, he served in the Hawaiian missions. In 1866, a sickness known as leprosy spread across the Hawaiian Islands. Lepers were exiled to the Island of Molokai. Father Damien volunteered to minister to them. He took care of them, built houses, hospitals, and churches. He contracted leprosy in 1885 and died in 1889. Pope John Paul II beatified Damien de Veuster In 1995.
