Galilee Most of Jesus' ministry was centered in Galilee, the northern section of Palestine. It was fertile land with olives, grapes, and wheat growing throughout the countryside. A main feature of the region was the Sea of Galilee where fisherman could be seen casting their nets. Just west of the lake is the village of Cana where Jesus performed his first miracle. While attending a wedding there, Jesus changed water into wine. After his Resurrection, Jesus returned to Galilee with a special message for his disciples.

OUR CATHOLIC TRADITION in Art

The Angelus The Angelus is a prayer that people have prayed since the Middle Ages. The prayer consists of the dialogue between Mary and the angel Gabriel, interspersed with a series of Hail Marys, followed by a closing prayer. By the fourteenth century, church bells were tolled at six in the morning, noontime, and six in the evening, reminding people to pray the prayer. This devotion is still popular today in many churches.
