Scripture Background

In the Time of Jesus

Upper Room In a Jewish home, the upper room was a spacious area on the second floor usually reserved for guests. In a one-story home, the upper room may have been a structure on the flat roof. Jesus chose an upper room in Jerusalem for the celebration of the Last Supper. Tradition identifies this same room as the place where the disciples received the Holy Spirit on Pentecost.

Descending Like a Dove The image of the Holy Spirit as a dove has been used from the earliest times in our Church's history. The dove is commonly used as a symbol of peace. Matthew 3:16 says, "After Jesus was baptized, he came up from the water and behold, the heavens were opened, and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove coming upon him." There are many paintings of the Baptism of Christ which include the descending dove. One of the best is Andrea del Verrocchio's *The Baptism of Christ* (1470).
