

Special Days of the Year

We celebrate holy days and other special days during the church year.
Other religions also have special feasts to celebrate.

Look up the dates in the chart below at www.blestarewe.com/litcal/index.html. Identify the feast for that day. Write what that feast celebrates from the description given there.

DATE	FEAST	WHAT IT CELEBRATES
January 1	Mary, Mother of God	Mary's Motherhood
February 2	Presentation	Mary and Joseph present the baby Jesus at the temple
February 21, 2007 or February 6, 2008	Ash Wednesday	Beginning of Lent; reminds us to "repent and live the Gospel"
April 8, 2007 or March 23, 2008	Easter	Jesus' resurrection from the dead
April 2, 2007 or April 18, 2008	Passover	Flight of Hebrews from Egyptian slavery
May 17, 2007 or May 1, 2008	Ascension	Jesus returns to his Father in heaven
September 12, 2007 or September 29, 2008	Rosh Hashanah	Jewish New Year
September 21, 2007 or October 8, 2008	Yom Kippur	Day of atonement, a day to pray for forgiveness
September 12, 2007 or September 1, 2008	Ramadan	Month of fasting for Muslims, much time spent in prayer

Dates with years are "moveable dates" they change each year. Jewish and Islamic feasts begin at sunset.
